What follows is perhaps the only time in modern history that Packards and Pierce-Arrows have participated in a gymkhana driving event. OK so what is a gymkhana? A gymkhana is a meet featuring sports contests or athletic skills: as a: competitive games on horseback b: a timed contest for automobiles featuring a series of events designed to test driving skill. In this instance it is a test of driving skills and automobile handling capabilities. There are an infinite number of variations for a gymkhana course. The course laid out for our group consisted of a series of cone placed approximately 60 feet apart for approximately an eight of a mile. The contestants zig zagged through the cones, turned around and zig zagged back to the starting point (without hitting any cones). Performance was measured by the time to drive through the cones and stopping as close to the stopping point cone as possible without hitting it. If the contestant hit a cone one second was added to their total time.



This was an outstanding tour along with all the qualities of a Packard Club event with our friends from the Pierce-Arrow Society as well as a few classic Car Club of America friends. But, it was much more than that. To my knowledge no Packard, Pierce-Arrow or CCCA club has ever did a gymkhana or competitive driving event in the U.S.A. Such crazy things have happened in Europe and some of the Scandinavian countries but not here that I have heard of. I have a photo of a 1935 V-12 Packard V-12 on the race track in Denmark. On Saturday April 13, 2016 in Borrego Springs Ca there were two Packards and three Pierce-Arrows driving all out through a competitive driving course. Four of these automobile are full classics according to the CCCA criteria. Tim's 34 Packard Roadster is a 98.75 point car that has won awards in more than one big show. In the automobile world such as the one we live in the dedication and involvement ranges from the car that is only driven on and off the trailer at a concours d'Elegance and there are many \$\$\$\$ involved in the total restoration. The owner requires resuscitation and maybe therapy if a fly lands on the car. The other end of the scale is the lady or gentleman who drives the car, keeps it looking and running as well as their pocket book allows. Commonly referred to as clean driver. We have a couple of guys in our club who are essentially doing both, Tim Pestotnik and Sean McNew. Tim has a completely restored 1934 Packard Roadster that is a Concours winner and is a driver. Sean McNew also shows his award winning Peirce-Arrow and drives it! In 2015 he drove the Pierce to Buffalo, New York for the Pierce-Arrow Society National convention. If there is a car show or a driving event you can count on seeing these two gentleman and their automobiles there.

Our annual flagship event. Packard/Pierce-Arrow Day @ Cruisin' Grand is right around the corner. Once again, we have secured the Friday closest to the Summer Solstice in order to maximize the amount of daylight we have before heading home while lighting the road with our 6- volt headlights. The date is Friday June 24th. You and your Packard or Pierce-Arrow are invited and encouraged to attend this FREE event.

As we do every year, we are extending a cordial invitation to our neighbors to the north, the <u>SoCal</u> <u>Region of PI</u> as well as to the Southern California Region of the <u>Pierce-Arrow Society</u>.

Here's the schedule:



**6:00 am** - Be at TV station KUSI, 4575 Viewridge Avenue, San Diego, with your classic ride for Dave Stall's morning car segment on the <u>Good Morning San Diego</u> Program. Dave will choose and interview several owners about their cars and their history. One never knows who he will pick to talk to.

7:00 am - We all head to the nearby Studio Diner at 4701 Ruffin Road, San Diego for a group breakfast.

**3:00 pm** - We meet up at <u>Japaleño Grill & Cantina</u> at 503 West Grand Avenue, Escondido for a free beverage and appetizer. The Board of Directors of the Packards International San Diego Region has agreed that our club's treasury will sponsor this event of the day. Expect to spend a leisurely late afternoon swapping stories and talking Packard stuff. Then we'll leave by 4:30 to go form up for the parade.

**By 4:45 pm** - Have your classic at the corner of East 4th Avenue & South Ivy Street, Escondido to form up for the *Parade of Packards & Pierce-Arrows* down Grand Avenue


**5:00 pm** - The *Parade of Packards and Pierce-Arrows* begins. Parade cars will be single file in year order. Oldest car leads the parade. Of the 26 Cruisin' Grand events held every year, this is the only parade of cars prior to the start of the event. In past years we had a motorcycle police escort courtesy of the <u>Escondido Police Department</u>. We have requested the escort again this year and hope to have confirmation soon.

**5:15 pm to 9:00 pm** - Your classic buggy is on display on South Broadway for the public to see, appreciate, and admire. Once again, the *PI San Diego Region Board of Directors* is planning all the niceties that add to the evening: People's Choice Award voting by the public, windshield placards for all pre-registered cars, parking in year order, a staffed information booth, and more. The presentation of the People's Choice Award will be made by Steve Waldron, Cruisin' Grand Founder and Organizer, at the 8:00 Awards Ceremony.

Expect LOTS of questions from the admiring public. (Like: Who made Packards? Is this a hearse? Are you the original owner? When did Mercedes stop making Packards? How do you shift it? etc)

Other fun facts and items of note about this year's event:

- 1) All Packards and Pierce Arrows are invited to any and all of the day's activities. There is no charge or registration fee. Membership in PI (or any region of PI) is NOT required. Please forward this to ANYONE you know who owns a Packard or Pierce Arrow. Also note that only Packards and Pierce-Arrows can be accommodated at KUSI, in the parade, and at Cruisin' Grand. We do, however, require every Packard and Pierce-Arrow owner to register ahead of time by completing and returning the registration form on the next page. Questions? Call Mark Burnside at 619-322-9340.
- 2) We will be parked in a special roped-off area of South Broadway. We need to have at least 25 Packards and Pierce-Arrows at the event to maintain this area exclusive to our makes. Fewer than 25 cars means that Cruisin' Grand event organizers can allow non-Packards and non-Pierce-Arrow to park in our space. We fervently want to avoid the shame and indignity associated with such an undesirable outcome.
- 3) You will be on your own for dinner. There are many nice restaurants along Grand Avenue from \$ to \$\$\$\$.
- 4) **Cruisin' Grand™** is a weekly cruise-in sponsored by the City of Escondido held every Friday night from the first Friday in April to the last Friday in September. On each Friday a classic vehicle organization is invited to display their vehicles in a special roped-off area for the evening. This event is special: It's an incredible outreach opportunity for us to present our classic motorcars to a (very) interested public. Out of the 26 Cruisin' Grand events held each year, *Packard/Pierce-Arrow Night* ranks a solid #3 in public interest (behind *Nitro Night* and *Fire Truck Night*). Attendance for Packard/Pierce-Arrow Night in previous years has been estimated at 5,000+. With this kind of interest and enthusiasm from the public, it only makes sense for us to mobilize every roadworthy Packard and Pierce-Arrow for the event. We sincerely hope that you will join us.

### "Ask The Man Who Owns One"

The Packard Motor Car Company was founded in 1899 in Warren, Ohio as the New York & Ohio Automobile Company. James Ward Packer founded the company after purchasing a Winton in 1898, which left him very dissatisfied. When he brought the car back to Winton, they told him that if he was so smart, he could build a car himself.

James Ward Packer built the first Packard car with his brother in their electric bell and lamp factory. The first car was completed in November of 1899.

The first advertisement to use the slogan, "Ask The Man Who Owns One," came in October of 1901. At that time, Packard already had a prestigious owner with New York millionaire William D. Rockefeller who used to previously drive Winton cars.

The origin of how the slogan came about has coalesced around the story of the secretary of J.W. Packard saying to him, "Here's a letter from a man who wants information about the dependability of Packard cars." Mr. Packard replied, "Since we have no sales literature yet, tell him to just "ASK THE MAN WHO OWNS ONE."

## Notable & Quotable: The 'New Devil-Wagon Disease' of 1904

'A discovery which has caused much amusement among automobilists.'





From the Reading (Pa.) Eagle, "New Devil-Wagon Disease: London Chauffeurs Afflicted With 'Motorpathea Cerebralis,' "April 14, 1904, cited online by Pessimists Archive:

The London medical profession has hit upon a new disease, called "motorpathea cerebralis," a discovery which has caused much amusement among automobilists. It explains itself, but the medical press enlarges upon it thus:

"The vibration of the automobile, especially at a high rate of speed, produces in some the same temporary disorganization of the functions that the motion of a ship does in an ill passenger, and nausea, giddiness and headache are the result of a fast journey over a rough road. The art of the builder of automobiles is able to reduce this disadvantage to a great extent by providing large and powerful springs, but some people, especially women, suffer considerably from the jolting and swinging. This upsets the normal equilibrium of the nervous system, and an unsteadiness of gait and shakiness of hand are the result.
