It is not too early to begin thinking about Cruisin' Grand, which is set for Friday May 29 in Escondido,







The engine was in running condition when it was removed from the car. It developed a knock which is probably a loose connecting rod. The engine has well under 10K miles on it since being overhauled about 4 years ago. The cylinder head was resurfaced and the cylinders were bored. Then, all new valves & guides and new pistons & rings were installed. The engine rebuild work was performed by Kenyon Machine Shop. The flywheel was resurfaced, and a new clutch & pressure plate and a new throw out bearing were also installed.

MORE ON A TWELVE VOLT CONVERSION AND OTHER AMAZING THINGS

Getting around starting issues

I have a 1938 Packard that I did not want to convert to 12-volt power. I wanted everything to operate as it did in 1938, but the poor quality starting power of the newer gasoline mix needs a faster-turning motor to start.

To solve my problem, I removed a sixvolt cable off the starter motor and bolted all of these wires together and wrapped them with tape. The control wire to the solenoid is still six-volt from the starter button. I purchased a 12-volt portable starter battery and placed it next to the starter motor and anchored it down with long pull tires. My car is positive ground. so I attached the negative clamp to the starter terminal and the positive clamp to a good, clean ground on the engine. The only time the 12-volt comes in to play is when the starter button is pushed in. The generator still charges the six-volt and all lights and gauges work as with a normal six-volt system.

I have never had any problem starting the car because of low voltage since making the above changes. I do carry a backup jumper, but have never had to use it. As a side benefit, anyone with a 12-volt car can give you a jump with no problem.

Water Succeeds Gasoline As New Invention Is Perfected



This water powered motor is the invention of G. H. Garrett, who is shown here with his right hand upon the electrolytic carburetor which obtains explosive hydrogen from water.

WATER powered automobiles are predicted for the not too distant future as the result of an invention of G. H. Garrett of Dallas, Texas, which substitutes water for gasoline.

Garrett uses an electrolytic carburetor which breaks up water by electrolysis into its component gases, hydrogen and oxygen, and then forces the explosive hydrogen into the combustion chambers for fuel

the combustion chambers for fuel.

For operating the automobile motor on which the tests have been conducted, Garrett has added an over-size generator to supply the extra electricity needed by the carburetor. Beyond that, the motor has needed no changes, though it has been in operation continuously for several days.

Garrett has protected his device with patents.

The September 8, 1935, The Dallas Morning News first announced that the water-fuel concept worked -- at least it worked for "several minutes," the article reported.

A few months later, Pathe' News filmed the car driving along Garland Road with the driver stopping at White Rock Lake to fill the fuel tank with water before cruising off. In 1970, Karen Klinefelter wrote, "Aptly enough, the film was shown on Pathe's Stranger than Fiction feature program."

C.H. Garrett said the only items needed to convert a gasoline-engine auto to a water burner was an electrolytic carburetor and installation of a generator of double normal capacity for the breaking down of the water.

He claimed instant starts in any weather, no fire hazards, cooler operation and plenty of power and speed. The car was not marketed, and no one seems to know its ultimate destiny. Both Garretts died a number of years ago.
