NATIONAL CITY HERITAGE DAYS CAR SHOW by Steve Ross

The Packards International Automobile Club San Diego Region joined over 185 other automobiles on the lawn at Kimball Park in National City for a beautiful day of automobile enjoyment. We had a fantastic collection of Packard Automobiles ranging from a 1929 Dietrich Convertible Coupe to a 1954 Pacific Hardtop. Packard was the featured Marquee this year and there were thirteen Packards on the field. It was a beautiful sight. We missed Karl Ramsing and his stunning 1929 convertible coupe but it was still in recovery from an unfortunate encounter with an inferior piece of Detroit iron. Phil Pizzuto and his Blue Bomb were unable to join us due to a family vacation. Some of us participated in the parade through the crowds and early morning mist of National City. The parade was long but moved pretty fast.

When the judging was complete we had three winners and of course some disappointed Packardites. Judging is always tough as well as the competition. BUT it is fun! When the judges tallied up the score there were three winners in the Packard class.

- First place went to Diane Feddersohn and her beautiful a 1954 Pacific hardtop. This was not Diane's first time to the winners circle. She has won in this show before.
- Second place went Scott Melcher and his 1953 Caribbean Convertible. Scott and his family were there to enjoy
 the show.
- Third place was awarded to Larry Johnson and his freshly restored 1949 sedan Deluxe Eight Touring Sedan. This is a beautiful car.

I am very glad I did not have to decide the order of awards for these fine Packards. They were all well prepared with outstanding form, fit and finish.

AND NOW FOR THE FINAL ANNOUNCEMENT, drum roll please, our very own Gary Wysong's 1941 Silver 120 Touring Sedan won People's Choice!! WOW what an accomplishment. I think this is more prestigious than the best in show personally. Gary was surprised but he should not have been. He has a nice well maintained Packard. I think it is called the Silver Ghost. Well it is now.

(Editor's note: Surprise is too underwhelming a word for the shock of having a judge approach you to line up your car in the winners line. The car was brought for display only, and wasn't even judged. The first thought was they had made a mistake in counting the votes, there were many more deserving cars on the field. This was a very fine compliment for a Packard from all the people attending this show, and I didn't vote for my own car!)

Bob Gunthorp, Tom Richards and Steve Ross, all members, of the Packard and/or the Mercedes Benz Club were asked and volunteered to be judges at the event. Bob Gunthorp has been a judge for several years at this and other car shows so he provided guidance to us less experienced judges. Judging is fun but also a bit hard as all of the cars are so nice! I noted that in this show, as in the past, some truly deserving cars were not winners because of missing owners manual, jacks, tools etc. This car show, as well as some others require these items to be checked off. Carol's (my wife) Mercedes Benz was not a winner because she did not have these items. And I was judging the Mercedes Benz automobiles!

Cool Classic Cars of San Diego Show

The Studebaker and Packard clubs joined forces Saturday August 22, 2009 in Balboa Park behind the Automobile Museum for a fun filled day of enjoying beautiful cars, raffles, food, and a free pass to the Automobile Museum. Richard Mill's, a member of our Board of Directors, 1950 Eight Touring Sedan is on display in the Automotive Museum. I guess one might say we had nine Packards there.

The variety of Studebakers in the show was impressive and interesting. The oldest was a 1923 I believe and there was a 1927 Erskine. The Erskine was named for the CEO of Studebaker and built from 1926 to 1930. The model was not successful and I doubt there are many of these around. The Model A Ford spelled doom for the Erskine.

We had eight Packards on the field among thirty some Studebakers. Steve Ross, 39 Super 8, Mark Burnside, 49 Limo, Todd Schonenberg, 39 Super Eight, Robert Buchanan, 33 Super Eight Five Passenger Coupe, Phil Pizzuto, 1939 120 Touring Sedan, Jack Heacock, 1953 Cavalier, Jim Woolsey, 1935 Twelve Limo and John Richards, 1958 Hawk. Five of these beauties were winners, one taking two awards!

To say the Packards did well in the trophy department would be an understatement. The winners were;

Peoples Choice and best grill award went to Robert Buchanan and his magnificent 1933 Super Eight five Passenger Coupe.

Best Engine Compartment, Jim Woolsey's 1938 Twelve Limo.

Car with the most accessories, Mark Burnsides 1949 Limo

Best original car, Jack Heacock's 1953 Cavalier

Best Dash, John Richard's 1958 Hawk. This is a stunning car fresh out of restoration.

In the raffle drawings yours truly did quite well winning 8 raffle prizes and the grand prize drawing of \$200.00. One Studebaker owner was heard commenting "not another Packard winner".
