

UNDERSTANDING SB 2050 By Alan K. Uke

"B2050 is a market based air pollution reduction program designed as an alternative to allerous federal and state ride sharing mandates. It encourages the motorist to make voluntary decisions to pollute less; when selecting vehicles and in driving habits.

SB2050 has three key features:

- (1) All cars in the state will receive pollution index numbers similiar to the present gas mileage index.
- (2) San Diego & Ventura counties can elect to implement the annual smog check program for the top 10% of polluters in lieu of furthur implementation of ridesharing programs
- (3) This program is a pilot which expires in 5 years

SB2050 consists of three main parts:

- (1) A pollution rating index.
- (2) A program for tracking vehicle miles.
- (3) Replacement and retrofit assistance for motorists.

Pollution Index and Pollution Mileage Targets:

- 1. The pollution index is a numerical rating system to inform the buyer/owner of the pollution potential of the vehicle. The index number would appear in vehicle registration forms. All vehicles for retail sale would have window stickers with the index number displayed.
- 2. Each non-attainment air district would analyze vehicle pollution distribution and develop pollution target miles for vehicles registered in the district. The pollution index number would be the basis for calculating the annual pollution mileage target for each vehicle. The higher the index number, the lower the number of target miles.

Initially, the pollution targets would be set high enough so that only vehicles which accumulate enough miles to put them in the top ten percent of polluters in the air district would exceed the targets. each year thereafter, the district's total target pollution mileage would be dropped by 5% unless air quality improved.

Tracking odometer mileage:

- 1. When a vehicle comes in for a smog check at license renewal, the odometer operation is confirmed by a simple visual inspection as part of the smog check procedure. The odometer reading is sent to DMV through the electronic data transfer system. If the odometer mileage exceeds the vehicle's mileage threshold, the vehicle will be required to have its next smog check in one year.
- 2. Vehicle owners who exceed the threshold have the following options to ensure they can avoid annual smog checks.
 - (A) They can drive less.
 - (B) They can trade to a lower indexed new or used car.
 - (C) They can retrofit their vehicle with an approved pollution control device or implement an approved maintenance program which will lower the index number.

Motorist Assistance

- 1. Stationary sources are allowed to purchase pollution offset credits from mobile source reduction programs. This option will finance buyback programs and other forms of assistance to purchasers of lower index vehicles.
- 2. If needed, the county's administrative costs for the program can be funded by a \$1 increase in the Registraion fee. Any excess funds would be used for repair assistance, vehicle buy-backs and development of retrofit devices.
