

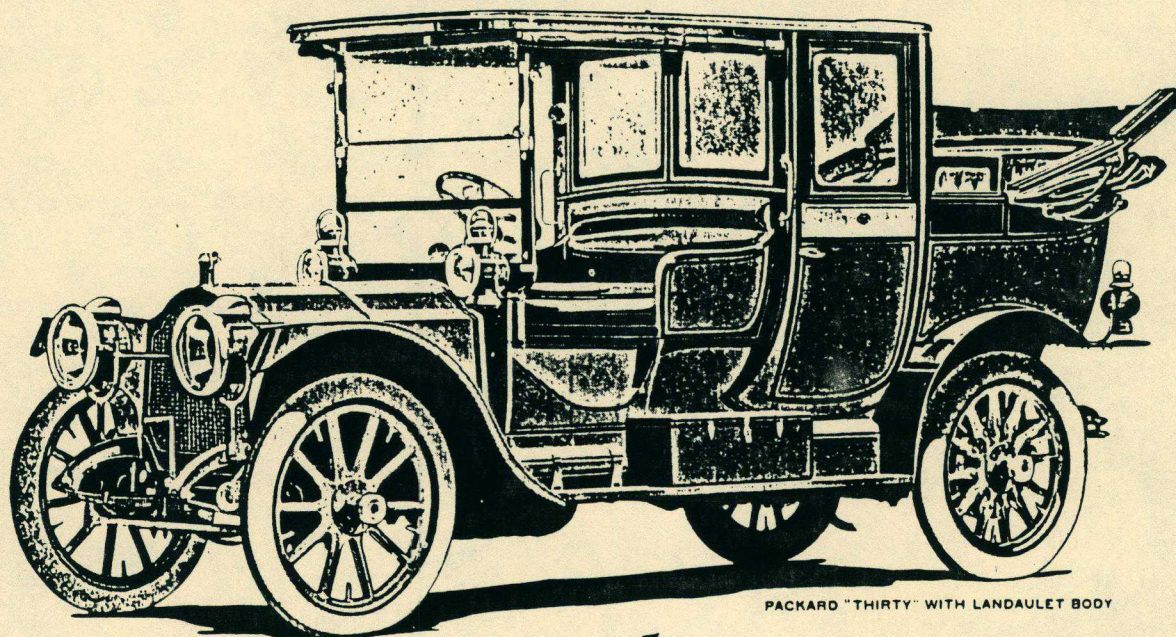

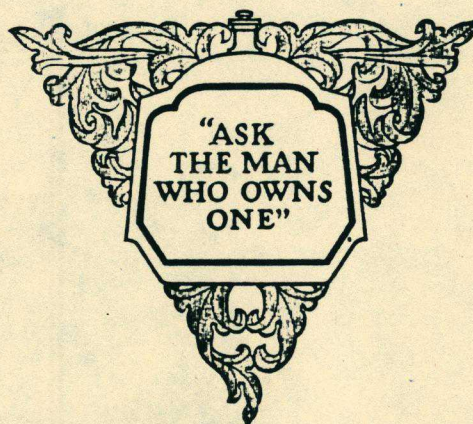

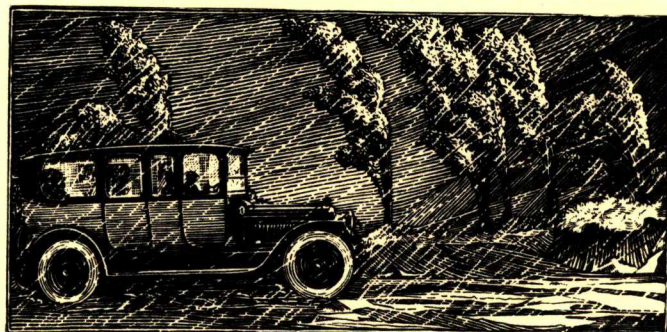

IN MEMORIAM

LONG-TIME SAN DIEGO REGION MEMBER UNABLE TO PERPETUATE FINAL GOAL

Edwin R. Henneberg, Sr., 71, of Allied Gardens, passed away on April 7, 1994, of acute leukemia. A native of San Diego, Ed graduated from San Diego State University with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. His professional career led him to General Dynamics/Convair Corporation where he worked as an Aerospace Design and Electrical Engineer in charge of instrumentation for the Mercury and Atlas rockets for NASA. In addition, other credits include the design of four (4) separate launch pads used by NASA at Cape Canaveral, Florida.


Following his retirement from General Dynamics, Ed ventured into the education field where he taught Machine/Auto Shop at Santana. It was during this period that he joined Packards International, San Diego Region in 1976. Upon meeting him, I discovered that he owned a 1956 Patrician, which was purchased new from renowned Packard dealer, Earle C. Anthony in Los Angeles. (A little note of trivia here: Did you know that Earle C. Anthony purchased the radio station KFI as a media for advertisement of (his) Packard dealership? Today, KFI is one of, if not *the* most widely listened-to AM radio stations in the country!) This vehicle was in remarkably fine original condition with low mileage, original paint and chrome, and outfitted with the optional Sport Sedan interior utilizing fine brocade with metallic thread and leather bolsters. To this day, the seats are covered in the original clear vinyl installed at the time it was purchased. Tragically, an electrical fire in the garage of the Henneberg home inflicted severe damage to the paint and glass of this meticulously preserved automobile. The other Packard in Ed's life was his 1936 V-12 roadster. He purchased it back in 1946 in the northern California town of Fairfield. After being towed to San Diego, Ed proceeded to give the car a complete mechanical restoration. Thereafter, in 1947-49, the family made many trips to St. Louis, MO and back in this durable vehicle. Shortly after our meeting in 1976, I had the pleasure of riding in it several times, before it was placed in storage to undergo a complete restoration. With patience and perseverance, Ed pursued the task of restoring the mighty V-12 to (its) original state which entailed hand-crafting many components on the lathes placed in his cramped garage. Sadly, time ran out for Ed, and he never saw his dream car reach its ultimate state of glory.

For many years, Ed dutifully served as technical advisor to the San Diego Region's members. Always anxious to provide instruction, he assisted me with the delicate job of overhauling Twin Ultramatic in my 1955 400 Hardtop.

Ed is survived by his wife, Rita, son, Edwin Jr., and daughter, Christine. His daughter is married and lives in Dana Point, a suburb of Orange County. His wife and son reside at the family home in Allied Gardens. His son has plans to restore both the '36 V-12 roadster and the '56 Patrician, continuing the task his father was unable to complete.

Memorial services were held at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery. San Diego Region members in attendance were Ginger McLean, Ron and Karen Crampton, Lloyd King, and Ken Yankee. Edwin Jr. (Rick) and family gave Ed his last ride in his '56 400 Packard to the Anza-Borrego desert where they scattered his ashes, an area shared by the family on many previous occasions.

CHINESE CHICKEN SALAD

BASIC INGREDIENTS:

- 2 or 3 Chicken breasts, baked or roasted, shredded
- 1 Head lettuce, sliced thin or shredded
- 4 Green onions, chopped thin or shredded
- PLUS: Any or all of the following vegetables, thinly sliced: cucumber, red or green bell pepper, carrots, red cabbage, or your own choice
- 1 cup Crisp chow mein noodles (wide or thin) OR 1/2 cup (dry) Maifun "Rice Stick" (See NOTES)
- Dressing: "Sun-Bird" Chinese Chicken Salad Seasoning mix

PREPARATION:

Combine and toss the lettuce, onions, and vegetables.
WAIT until just before serving to add chicken, noodles (or Maifun), and dressing.

NOTES:

The "Sun-Bird" Seasoning Mix and the Maifun Rice Stick are found in the ethnic food section of most supermarkets.
Maifun "Rice Stick": Deep-fry in HOT oil a little at a time until puffed. Drain on paper towels. It takes only a few seconds to puff, so WATCH CAREFULLY.
Chicken: You can use pre-cooked BBQ roasted chicken from the deli or grocery store.
