In 1947, a group of WWII Veterans formed the Oilers Car Club, an assembly of friends who raced their hand-crafted hot rods. Inspired by this group in October of 2016 The Race of Gentlemen raced at Pismo beach.

The weekend was a historic look at the early days of hot rodding. All the race cars had to be from between 1905-1940 American-chassis and engines, with no parts manufactured after 1948. It was a rainy weekend and high tides shortened the racing activities but the roar of vintage iron filled the air as soon as the clouds broke. The Packard was good for 2 wins and one loss but the whole weekend was a big winner for all that braved the elements.

The long term project to fully restore this beautiful classic back to its original glory is underway but it was fun to run the car in its un-restored condition.

The engine was in running condition when it was removed from the car. It developed a knock which is probably a loose connecting rod. The engine has well under 10K miles on it since being overhauled about 4 years ago. The cylinder head was resurfaced and the cylinders were bored. Then, all new valves & guides and new pistons & rings were installed. The engine rebuild work was performed by Kenyon Machine Shop. The flywheel was resurfaced, and a new clutch & pressure plate and a new throw out bearing were also installed.
