Terry said he was referred to as 'The Kid', by his fellow attorneys. I bet he has some exciting experiences to tell. His brother Mel Knoepp was a news anchor and hosted the Sun Up show on Channel 8.

Wringer Tub

OK, I know this is

not a Packard but a Maytag washing machine and it is pictured here for our more junior members. This is a clothes washing machine used in the first part of the last century and was called a wringer-washer. This means you wash the clothes, then run them through a wringer to remove the soapy water. Soapy water removed, the clothes went onto the rinse water to remove the rest of the soap and wrung out again. The clothes were then hung outside in the sun to dry, an early energy savings idea that has been replaced by a clothes dryer with heat provided by electricity or gas. This machine is powered either by electricity or a gasoline engine.




