The weekend began with the Concours d'Elegance Drive which started from fellow MBCA member Chuck Spielman's, *Only Yesterday Classic Autos*, one of the premier automotive and memorabilia collections in California.



REPORT FROM THE FIELD

Richard Schauer

Periodically we like to brag. There are members who are making great strides toward getting their Packards back on the road. This is worthy of recognition in our eyes, so such members by rights should be showcased. Many/most of us have been down this path with our own Packards, suffering the pain, financial impact, delays, disappointments, and then final victory. Today we recognize two members:

Scott Melcer: One year ago, the engine was removed from his beautiful 1953 Caribbean Convertible for a complete rebuild. Mark Ballerini took on the task. Engine restoration was finished in March and installation was completed in April. Such undertakings are demanding and require a team effort. Scott and Mark took the lead with help from Scott's son Harry and me. I had the pleasure of being on hand to lend assistance and felt the satisfaction and excitement that comes from seeing a big project drawing to a close. It was challenging to maneuver the big Packard engine back home amidst an engine compartment that is pristine. Everything went smoothly. As of this writing the startup of the engine has not yet happened, but it's not far away.





Pete Haviar: Pete is doing nothing less than a complete ground-up restoration of his 1956 Caribbean hard top. Disappointments have come his way. Pete and Susan so badly hoped the Packard would be ready to escort their daughter and son-in-law at their wedding last December, but it was not to be. However, much progress has been made. Paint is complete in the factory 3-tone colors. The engine and transmission are installed. Pete had his Caribbean retrofitted with a correct Packard A/C system requiring a great deal of extra work and patience. Additional changes had to be made to correct problems carried over from the prior owner, such as replacing the missing transmission control switch. Pete has a great attention to detail and is going to great lengths to restore his Packard correctly. Dash is ready for installation as are engine compartment components. Steering column is also ready to roll. There are so many details in a restoration. Pete's Packard will be a perfect car when it is finished.
