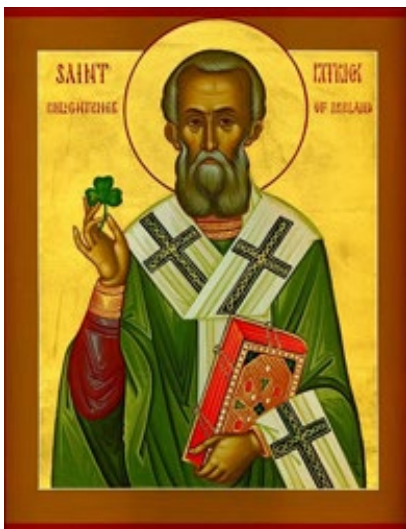


No one found the hidden Predictor in February

1737: St. Patrick's Day Comes to America

The well-heeled members of [Boston's Irish community](#) celebrated America's first St. Patrick's Day in 1737 as a gesture of solidarity among the city's new Irish immigrants. New York would hold its first St. Patrick's celebration in 1756 at the Crown and Thistle Tavern. The March 17 celebration started in 1631 when the Church established a Feast Day honoring St. Patrick. He had been Patron Saint of Ireland who died around the fifth century—a whopping 12 centuries before the modern version of the holiday was first observed. Very little is known about who he actually was.

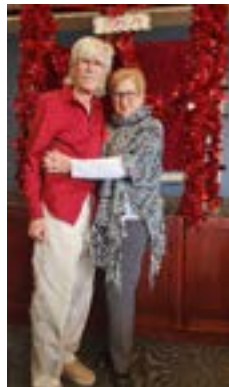

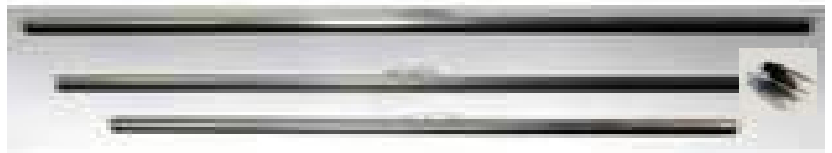

Gary Wysong is selling his 1941 Packard 120 Touring Sedan. His desire is to sell it to a member of our Region and is giving them first opportunity to assume the custody and care for this nice Packard.



Gary's description and some history on the Packard and his conditions for sale.

Steve,

Ann and I are ready to sell our 1941 Packard 120 4-door Touring Sedan with side mounts.

We haven't been active in the Club and it's time for someone else to have a chance to take pride in owning this Packard. I always felt it was a privilege to own a Packard, all of us are just temporary owners, because each Packard was built to last several generations.

My mother, Ruthe, is doing ok for 101 years old. Ann and I were her full time caregivers for 5 years in our home and we moved her into a board and care home last March in Chula Vista.

I prefer this Packard be offered for sale by word of mouth, for someone in the San Diego Region to have a first chance to buy it. We would like to sell this car in the next few weeks.

You have so many friends and contacts in the area, would you be interested in spreading the word?

If you can't think of someone local, the next best choice is for a Packard Club member in Orange County or Los Angeles County.

I don't want to advertise the car unless I need to, but prefer it go to a Packard Club member.

I have some history for the car, memorabilia, books, collectibles and some spare parts, including NOS water pump, clear glass turn signal lenses and red glass tail light lenses. They're all included in the sale.

I bought a new 6 volt battery and ran the engine to normal operating temperature today. The oil pressure was at mid point, 40 psi. The brake pedal operates just like it should.

The car can be driven and the engine runs well with no engine knocks, as you might hear with a bad main bearing. The piston rings are probably worn because the car smokes from the tail pipe when going downhill.

There are mechanical things to be fixed. The speedometer cable is broken and the odometer reads about 18,000 miles, 118,000 miles is more likely. The fuel gauge and the windshield wipers don't work. It's just a partial list, but the things I remember being an issue.

The front shocks were rebuilt and a rebuilt transmission with overdrive was installed by Jim Woolsey.

My asking price for the car is \$19,500 and it's not negotiable. Cash is preferred, a personal check will prevent the buyer from taking the car until the check is cleared.

A serious buyer can come to see and drive the car as soon as Sunday, January 22, 2023.

The Packard will be sold to the first serious buyer able to come see the car during daylight hours. I don't want to re-park the car in my garage with tight clearances after dark, or have it out in the rain.

I prefer to be contacted **first** by text message at 619-322-6271, because I **don't** take calls from **unknown callers**, especially when driving. My email address is still gwysong@cox.net

I have an original Dupont "Packard Colors For 1940 Models" Bulletin for you. It has the color chips, color mixing formulas and color combinations. I also have a May 2001, Volume 38, Issue 5, copy of our local Predictor Newsletter. Also, a Packards International Magazine from Summer 2000 that features the 1940 Packard.

One of my fun memories is riding as your copilot around the NAS Coronado race track during the Historic Races weekend. I don't remember if the car's nickname was Buttercup or Yellow Peril for that ride!
